REPORT: California Air Resources Board Monthly Meeting

SYNOPSIS: The California Air Resources Board held public Board meetings on June 27, 2024 and July 25, 2024. The following are the summaries of the meetings.

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The June Board meeting of the California Air Resources Board (Board) was held in Riverside, California at the Mary D. Nichols Campus, Southern California Headquarters. Key items presented are summarized below.

DISCUSSION ITEMS

24-3-1 Public Meeting to Consider the Proposed South Coast Air Basin Attainment Plan for the 2012 Annual PM2.5 Standard

The Board adopted the South Coast Air Basin Attainment Plan for the 2012 12 microgram per cubic meter ($\mu\text{g}/\text{m}^3$) annual fine particulate matter (PM2.5) standard (Attainment Plan). The Attainment Plan incorporates emission reductions from measure commitments in the California Air Resources Board 2022 State SIP Strategy, and reductions from South Coast Air District measures, to demonstrate attainment of the 12 $\mu\text{g}/\text{m}^3$ annual PM2.5 standard by December 31, 2030. In addition, the Attainment Plan meets all other requirements of the Clean Air Act. The Attainment Plan and relevant portions of the CARB Staff Report will be submitted to U.S. EPA as a revision to California's State Implementation Plan.

South Coast AQMD Staff Comments/Testimony: Staff provided testimony supporting CARB's adoption of the South Coast Air Basin Attainment Plan for the 2012 Annual PM2.5 Standard.

24-3-2 Public Hearing to Consider Proposed Zero-Emission Forklift Regulation

The Board adopted the Zero-Emission Forklift Regulation (Regulation) which will phase out the operation of nearly all large spark-ignited (LSI) forklifts in California over time and spur the use of zero-emissions alternatives. Under the rule, beginning in 2026, manufacturers will not be able to produce or sell, for use in California, Class IV LSI forklifts and Class V LSI forklifts with a rated capacity of 12,000 pounds or less, except in very limited circumstances. LSI forklifts largely operate on propane, gasoline and natural gas. In addition, starting in 2028, the Regulation will phase out the use of LSI forklifts in large fleets. The phase-out schedule is by model year and designed so that no forklift is required to be phased out before it is 10 years old. Smaller fleets will phase out use of LSI forklifts starting in 2029. The Board also certified the Regulation's Final Environmental Impact Analysis.

The July Board meeting of the California Air Resources Board (Board) was held in Sacramento, California at the California Environmental Protection Agency Headquarters Building. Key items presented are summarized below.

CONSENT ITEM

24-4-1 Public Meeting to Consider Proposed Transport State Implementation Plan

The Board adopted proposed amendments to the transport portion of the California Infrastructure State Implementation Plan (Transport Plan) for the 2015 0.070 part per million 8-Hour Ozone Standard. The Transport Plan will be submitted to U.S. Environmental Protection Agency as a revision to California's State Implementation Plan.

DISCUSSION ITEMS

24-4-2 Public Meeting to Consider the San Joaquin Valley 2024 State Implementation Plan for the 2012 12 µg/m³ Annual PM_{2.5} Standard, to Consider Amendments to the Agricultural Equipment Incentive Measure and the 1997 15 µg/m³ State

The Board adopted the San Joaquin Valley 2024 State Implementation Plan for the 2012 12 µg/m³ annual PM_{2.5} standard (2024 PM_{2.5} Plan) in addition to amendments to the San Joaquin Valley Agricultural Equipment Incentive Measure (Valley Incentive Measure) and the State Implementation Plan Revision for the 15 µg/m³ PM_{2.5} Standard (15 µg/m³ SIP Revision). The Board also heard an update on the implementation of the San Joaquin Valley 2018 Plan for the 1997, 2006, and 2012 PM_{2.5} Standards. CARB will submit the 2024 PM_{2.5} Plan along with the CARB Staff Report, in addition to the amendments to the Valley Incentive Measure and the 15 µg/m³ SIP Revision contained

in the CARB Staff Report to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency for inclusion in the California SIP.

24-4-3 Public Meeting to Consider Proposed Recommendation to Select the South Sacramento-Florin Community to Transition to Develop a Community Emissions Reduction Program

The Board approved the development of a Community Emissions Reduction Program (CERP) in the South Sacramento-Florin community. Since 2018, the Board has selected 19 communities to include in the Community Air Protection Program that are either developing or implementing a community air monitoring plan (CAMP), a CERP, or both. The South Sacramento-Florin Community was selected by the Board as one of the first communities in 2018 to develop and implement a CAMP. Following the Board’s direction that communities previously selected for a CAMP be prioritized for development of a CERP, CARB staff recommended that the Board consider the selection of the South Sacramento-Florin Community to transition to develop a CERP. Board approval of the South Sacramento-Florin community to transition to develop a CERP will see the development of focused actions to address community issues and concerns.

24-4-4 Public Meeting to Hear Community Air Protection Program Annual Progress Update

The Board heard the annual update on the implementation progress of the Community Air Protection Program. Assembly Bill (AB) 617 (Garcia, Chapter 136, Statutes of 2017) requires air districts to prepare an annual implementation report for each community emissions reduction program (CERP), and CARB’s Office of Community Air Protection (OCAP) prepared the Community Air Protection Program Annual Progress Report based on the air districts annual reports and CARB’s progress to meet commitments in Blueprint 2.0. The update for the Board focused on the findings in this Report regarding the progress of CERP implementation in thirteen communities that are the furthest along in CERP implementation and included related updates on monitoring and enforcement. Elements of the update included a video highlighting progress in three communities and a three-person panel representing an air district and community members.

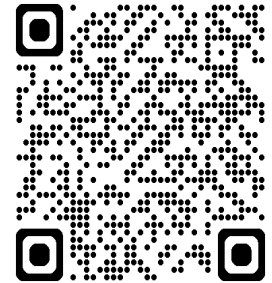
