BACKGROUND

This report summarizes the activities of the Legislative, Public Affairs and Media Office for March. The report includes Major Events, Community Events/Public Meetings, Environmental Justice (EJ) Update, Speakers Bureau/Visitor Services, Communications Center, Public Information Center, Small Business Assistance, Media Relations, and Outreach to Community Groups and Governments.

MAJOR EVENTS (HOSTED AND SPONSORED)

Each year, staff engage in hosting and sponsoring several major events throughout South Coast AQMD's four-county jurisdiction to promote, educate, and provide important information to the public regarding reducing air pollution, protecting public health, and improving air quality while minimizing economic impacts.

There were no major events hosted or sponsored in March.

COMMUNITY EVENTS/PUBLIC MEETINGS

Staff engaged with residents and stakeholders of diverse communities to provide information about the agency, incentive programs, and ways individuals can help reduce air pollution through events and meetings sponsored by South Coast AQMD or in partnership with others. Attendees typically receive information regarding the following:

- Tips on reducing their exposure to smog and its negative health effects;
- How to file a complaint;
- Clean air technologies and their deployment;
- Invitations to or notices of conferences, seminars, workshops, and other public events;
- South Coast AQMD incentive programs;
- Funding/grant opportunities by South Coast AQMD and partner agencies;
- Ways to participate in South Coast AQMD's rules and policy development; and
- Assistance in resolving air pollution-related problems.

Staff attended and/or provided information and updates at the following March events and meetings:

San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments

On March 5, staff provided updates at the San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments Energy, Environment & Natural Resources and Transportation Committee meetings about our Climate Pollution Reduction Grant proposal on goods movement, South Coast AQMD's Governing Board Student Intern Program, and Why Healthy Air Matters Education Program (WHAM) and Clean Air Program for Elementary Students (CAPES) Virtual Earth Day events.

Lake Arrowhead Communities Chamber of Commerce

On March 5, staff attended the Lake Arrowhead Communities Chamber of Commerce Legislative Committee meeting and shared South Coast AQMD's press release on U.S. EPA's proposed disapproval of the 1997 Ozone Contingency Measure Plan.

Reach Out

On March 5, staff attended Reach Out's monthly meeting and invited members to register for the 34th Annual Clean Air Awards and provided information on how to file an air quality complaint.

South Bay Association of Chambers of Commerce

On March 5, staff attended the monthly meeting of the South Bay Association of Chambers of Commerce and provided information regarding the upcoming hearing for Rule 1118: Control of Emissions from Refinery Flares, CAPES, WHAM, virtual Earth Day events and the 34th Annual Clean Air Awards.

Los Angeles Mayor Karen Bass' Office of Community Engagement

Harbor Association of Industry and Commerce

On March 21, staff attended a Harbor Association of Industry and Commerce's Government Affairs Committee meeting and invited attendees to register for the 34th Annual Clean Air Awards and provided program updates regarding the Carl Moyer Program.

Orange County Water District's Children's Water Education Festival

On March 27 and 28, South Coast AQMD hosted an interactive booth at the Orange County Water District's Children's Water Education Festival at UC Irvine. Staff presented the CAPES and WHAM curriculum to educate students on air quality.

Baldwin Park

On March 30, staff participated in the Baldwin Park Arbor Day event to provide community members information on air quality programs, including the 34th Annual Clean Air Awards, CAPES, WHAM, virtual Earth Day events, the Residential Electric Lawn Mower Rebate program and Replace Your Ride.

ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE UPDATE

The following are key EJ related activities that staff participated in during March. These events and meetings involve communities affected disproportionately by adverse air quality impacts.

U.S. EPA Community Change Grants Community Plans

On March 5, staff participated in U.S. EPA’s Community Change Grants Community Plans: Engagement, Governance, and Strength webinar. The presentation included requirements of federal grants, including Build America, Buy America, Davis Bacon, and post-award requirements.

CARB

On March 19, staff participated in CARB’s Implementation Workgroup on the statewide Clean Cars 4 All (CC4A) and Financing Assistance programs. These programs will expand the CC4A Program to air districts that do not implement it locally and provide a statewide financing program.

CARB

On March 26, staff participated in CARB’s workgroup on implementation of the fiscal year (FY) 2023-2024 policy for the Hybrid and Zero-Emission Truck and Bus Voucher Incentive Project. Topics covered included funding updates and an implementation timeline.

SPEAKERS BUREAU/VISITOR SERVICES

South Coast AQMD regularly receives requests for staff to speak on air quality-related issues from a wide variety of organizations, such as trade associations, chambers of commerce, community-based groups, schools, hospitals, and health-based organizations. South Coast AQMD also hosts visitors from around the world who meet with staff on a wide range of air quality issues.

There were no speaking engagements nor visitors in March.

SMALL BUSINESS ASSISTANCE

South Coast AQMD notifies local businesses of proposed regulations so they can participate in the agency’s rule development process. Major Media Topics:

- **Vehicle Emission Standards:** Staff participated in an interview with ABC7 to discuss how U.S. EPA's new vehicle emission standards could affect our air quality locally.
- **AB 617 Air Filtration School Event:** Staff organized a media availability event at School of Santa Isabel to highlight the installation of air filtration systems. Event was attended by Spectrum, KTLA, ABC7, CBS/KCAL, Univision and Channel 35.
- **Applied Medical Warehouse Violation:** Los Angeles Times (LA Times) requested confirmation on whether Applied Medical received a notice of violation (NOV) for not complying with the Warehouse Indirect Source Rule. Response was provided.
- **Ecobat/Quemetco Notice of Violations:** National Public Radio requested information on two NOVs issued on February 29, 2024, follow up information on settlement procedures and timing, and disposition of penalties for 23 NOVs issued since 2005. Response was provided.
- **Volkswagen (VW) Program:** FreightWaves inquired about the VW program, where this funding fits in the range of other zero emission vehicle funding and tax breaks that are available. Response was provided.
- **Tesla:** TechCrunch requested a copy of our Charging and Fueling Infrastructure Funding application. Reporter was instructed to submit a public records request.
- **Air Quality in Inland Empire:** CalMatters requested information regarding air quality issues in the Inland Empire, and active or upcoming programs in Riverside and San Bernardino counties. Response was provided.
- **Air Quality and Pollen:** LA Times requested information on how high winds can affect the air quality and pollen in the air. Referred reporter to other agencies.
- **PhibroTech:** LA Times requested copies of NOVs and Notices to Comply issued to the PhibroTech facility in Santa Fe Springs from 2014 to the present. Reporter was instructed to submit a Public Records Request.
- **Disneyland Emissions:** LA Times requested comments on complaints on emissions from the Autopia ride at Disneyland. Response was provided.
- **Ethylene Oxide (EtO):** Grist had questions regarding the tiered approach to EtO Rule (Rule 1405), as well as the reason behind inclusion of warehouses and the finalization of the rule. Response was provided.
- **Remote Sensors:** The New York Times requested to speak with an expert on remote sensors and/or satellite imagery that tracks pollution from animal waste in farms. Referred reporter to San Joaquin and Imperial County Air Pollution Control Districts.

- **Chiquita Canyon Landfill (CCL):** The Signal inquired whether any of the violations issued to CCL have resulted in fines. Response was provided.
