

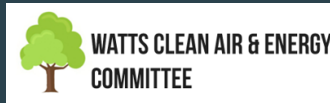
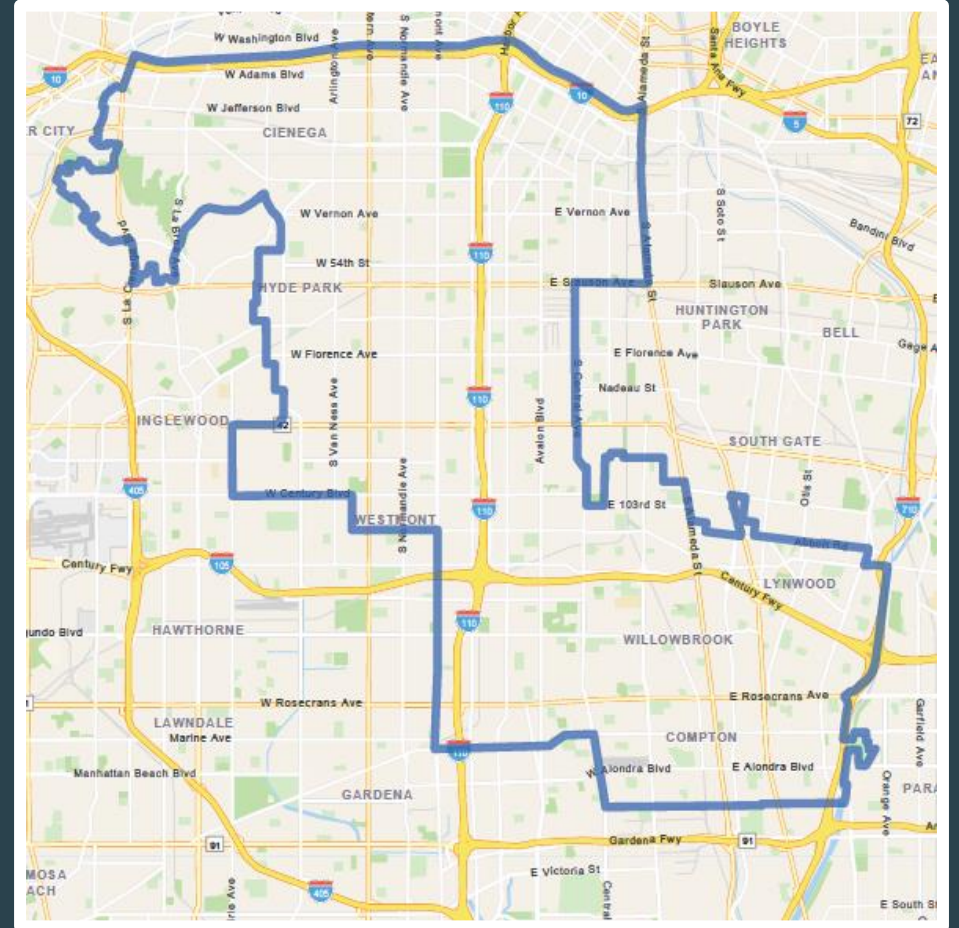

Language Justice

SLOW DOWN

Facilitators, presenters, trainers, participants... anyone speaking during the event, **speak at a moderate pace**. **Take a breath** after each sentence, **take a pause** after switching speakers and asking questions. Slowing down supports **EVERYONE**, not just interpreters.



SPEAK-UP

Speak loud and clear! Ideally, **using headphones with a mic**. Interpreters need to be able to hear the speaker over the sound of their own voice when doing simultaneous interpretation.

SAY YOUR NAME EACH TIME YOU SPEAK

Folks listening to the interpretation might only hear the interpreters voice, so they will not notice when a new person is speaking.



ONE PERSON AT A TIME

Interpreters can only interpret for **one person at a time**, and they don't want to be put in the position of having to decide which voice to privilege over another.

LANGUAGE IS NOT A BARRIER

To the contrary, when we have multiple languages in a space, **we have multiple cosmovisions**, and multiple ways of understanding the world. We have the opportunity to expand and deepen our perspective, our imaginations, the possible strategies, tactics, and visions for what is possible.



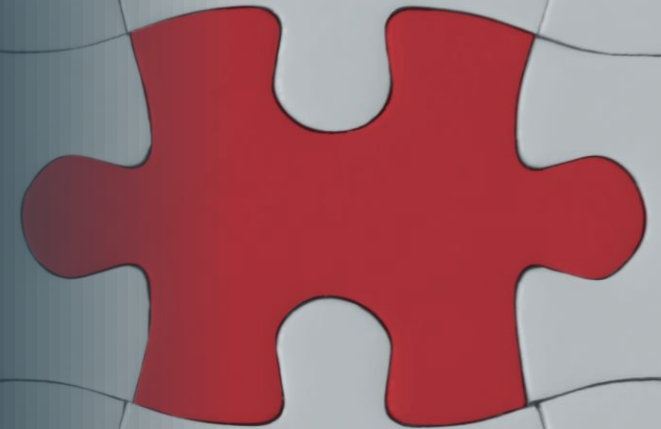

Potential Projects for Discussion in Working Teams: CERP Air Quality (AQ) Priorities Connections

Just Transition & Community Mobility

Mobile Sources

- Work with local school districts to support air filtration projects to reduce student's exposure to air pollution (e.g., air filtration systems)
- Explore opportunities for cleaner mobile source technologies

Auto Body Shops

- explore low-volatile organic compound (VOC) paint and coatings, and water-based cleaners

General Industrial Facilities

- options to transition equipment to community-identified alternatives (e.g., dry cleaners, industrial facility equipment)

Metal Processing Facilities

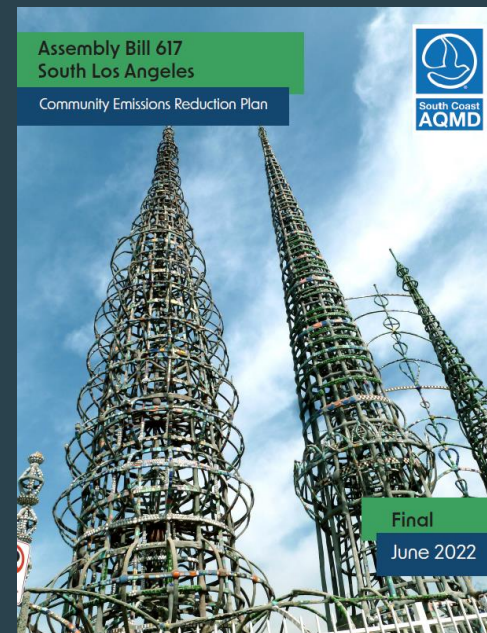
- incentivize businesses to incorporate best management practices and use of emission reduction technologies

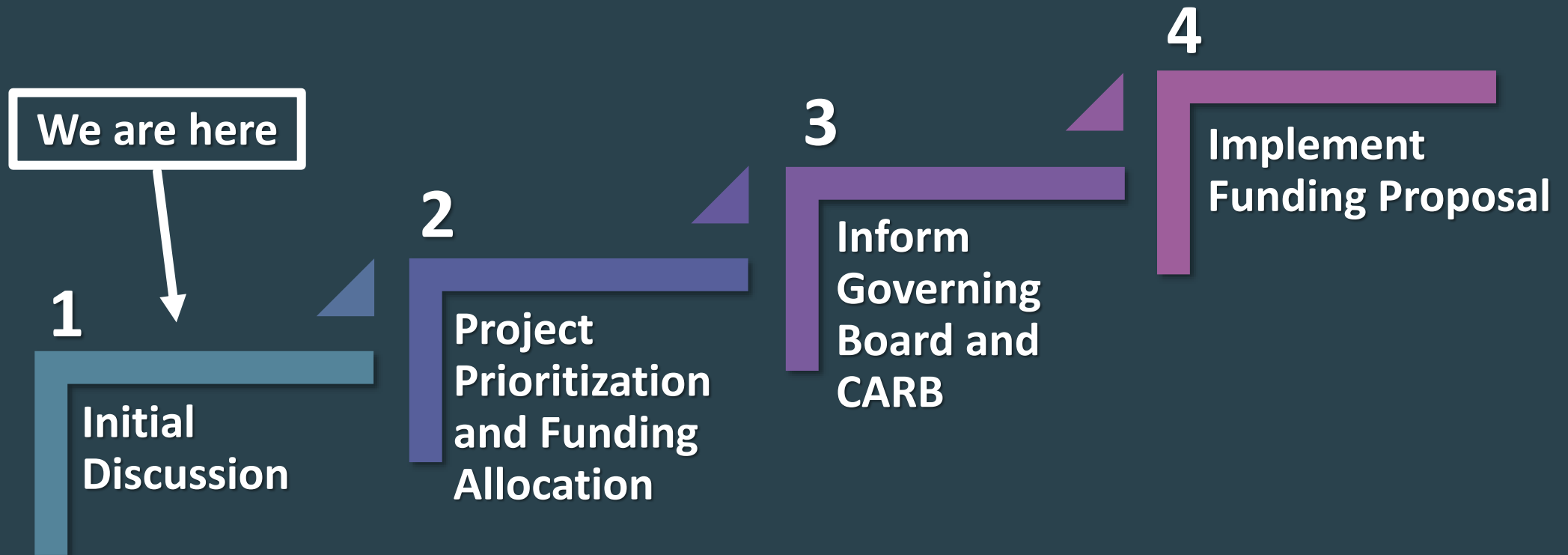

Participatory Budgeting Process Overview

1

Initial Discussion

Based on CERP objectives, CSC members suggest and discuss ideas for community-identified projects

2

Project Prioritization and Funding Allocation

CSC members build consensus to:

- Select community-identified projects
- Prioritize community-identified projects
- Allocate funds to each community-identified project

3

Inform Governing Board and CARB

Staff drafts and submits the funding proposal to the South Coast AQMD Governing Board and CARB

4

Implement Funding Proposal

South Coast AQMD begins implementation and outreach of community-identified projects. Prior to disbursement of funds, implementation may require:

- Development of Project Plans and approval by CARB
- Requests for Proposals


Click "Breakout Room" on the bottom bar, then select the Room you wish to join*

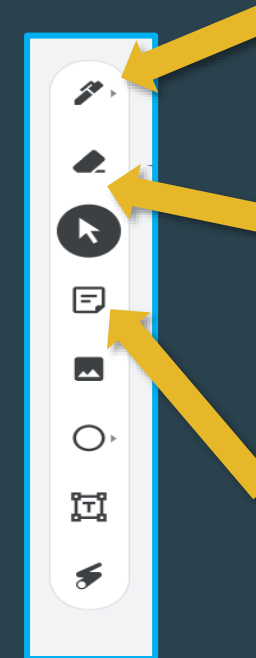
As we proceed through this activity, consider the following:

Jamboard Instructions

How to use Jamboard?

Within the Jamboard app, you will see the tools menu on the left-hand side of your screen. These tools will help you write, draw, create, and communicate within the app.



1. The **PEN** tool can be used as a regular pen, a marker, a highlighter, or a brush. Plus, you can use one of six different colors to write.

2. The **ERASER** tool is to undo something YOU added to the Jamboard. In collaborative environments, we want to be sure no one's efforts are either accidentally erased or intentionally removed.


3. The **STICKY NOTE** tool will be used to capture your input. You may type general or specific input, color your sticky note, then size and position it on the Jamboard.
