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Class 1 Permit Modification for DeMenno-Kerdoon dba World Oil Recycling

South Coast Air Quality Management District (South Coast AQMD) staff appreciates the opportunity to provide comments on the above-mentioned document. According to the Public Notice of Class 1 Permit Modification, DeMenno-Kerdoon dba World Oil Recycling (WOREC and also referred to as the facility) owns and operates a hazardous waste facility that treats, stores, recycles, and transfers used oil, used anti-freeze, oily water and contaminated oil, and petroleum products. The facility is located at 2000 North Alameda Street on the southeast corner of North Alameda Street and East Pine Street in the City of Compton. WOREC's activities are regulated under a Hazardous Waste Facility Part B Permit issued by the Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC). The permit modification informs the DTSC of WOREC's intent to install an ancillary suction heater to a waste oil Tank 2003. It is recommended that the DTSC and the facility owner/operator review the provisions of South Coast AQMD Rule 219¹ to determine if any such equipment might require a written Permit to Construct and a written Permit to Operate from South Coast AQMD.
